ADDITIONAL REMARKS

00-04 Anchored in berth E, U. S. Naval Base, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba in 7 fathoms of water, mud bottom, with 7 fathoms of water, mud bottom, with 45 fathoms of chain to the port anchor on the following true bearings: Hospital Cay Light 034, Granadillo Point Light 059, BBL 102, Signal Tower 197. Boiler #4 on the line and generators #3 and #4. Material condition YOKE is set below the second deck. Ships present include USS ABBOT (DD-629), USS HUNT (DD-674), USS MULLINIX (DD-944). SOPA is commanding officer USS BOSTON (CAG-1)

08-12 Anchored as before. 0825 Held quarters for inspection. Mustered the crew at quarters. Absentees: None. 0835 Received two caskets containing the remains of the unknown dead of the Pacific Theatre of World War II and the Korean Conflict. 0850 Secured the caskets in forward missile overhaul area. Secured the crew from quarters. 0915 Made weekly test of magazine sprinkling systems. Test satisfactory. 0920 Made daily inspection of magazines and smokeless powder samples. Conditions normal. 1000 Set material condition YOKE throughout the ship. 1031 Stationed the Special Sea and Anchor Detail. 1045 Received ship's vehicles from YC-1368 alongside the port quarter. 1110 Underway in accordance with COMCRULANT employment schedule 1958. Captain and Navigator are on the bridge. OOD has the deck and the conn. Commenced maneuvering at various courses and speeds to depart Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. 1133 Passed Windward Point Light abeam to port, distance 1400 yards. Set course 128, speed 15 knots. 1135 Secured the special sea and anchor detail.

Ammunition expended: 22 rounds of 5"/38 VT frag projectiles with 22 rounds of SPDN powder and 67 rounds of 3"/50 VT frag. projectiles with no casualties. 1552 C/C to 043.
